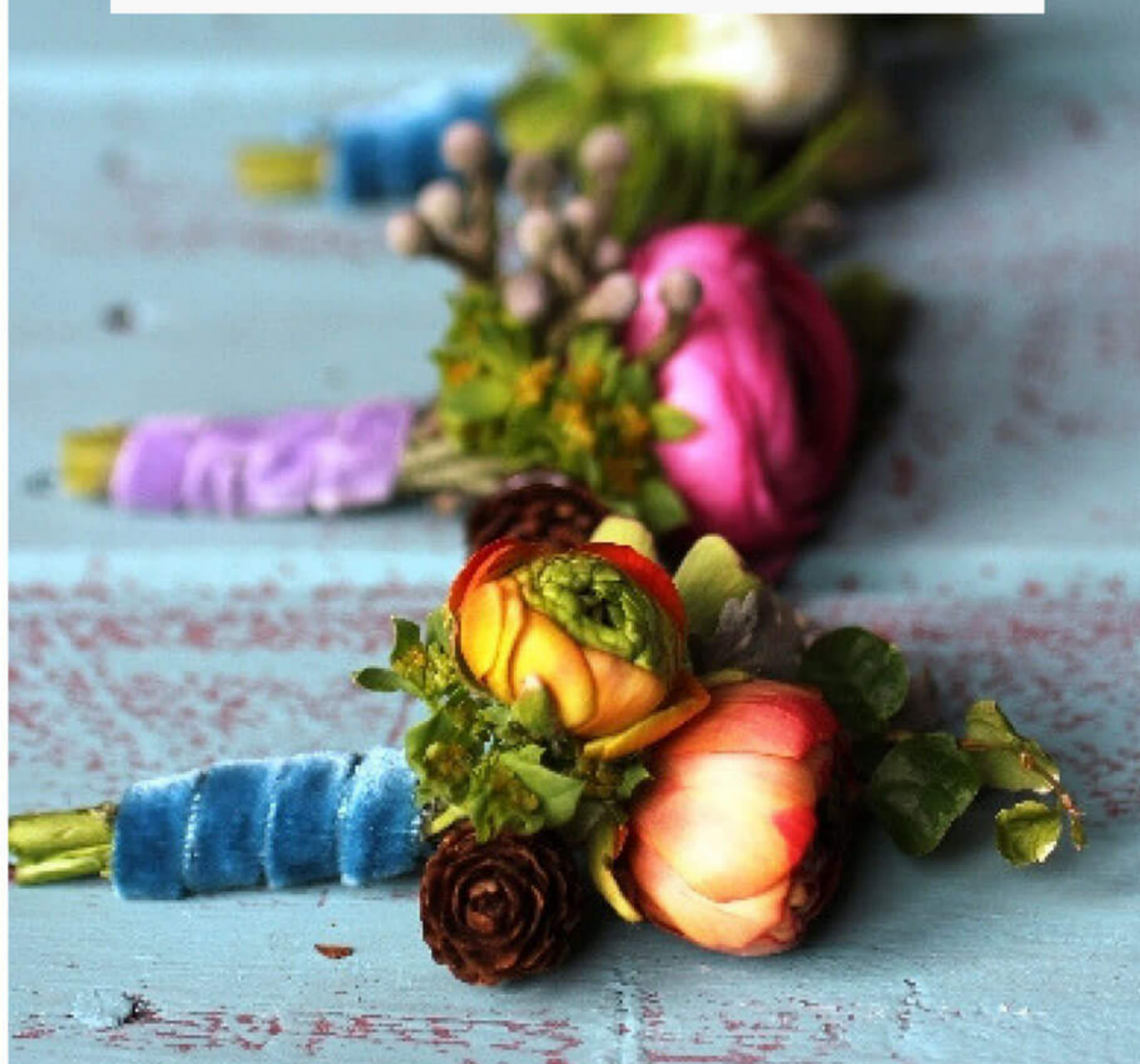


DIY WEDDING BUTTONHOLE.

HOW TO MAKE A BUTTONHOLE IN 7 EASY STEPS

YOU WILL NEED

Fresh flowers
Floral scissors
Floral wire or tape

Ribbon
Pins (decorative)

1. Lay out your flowers (craspedia and feverfew work well together, as do hydrangeas with rosemary, or olive twigs with bright berries).
2. Gather the stems into a layout you like, adding in foliage at the back to protect the flowers when the buttonhole is being worn.
3. Wire or tape the stems together - you can tape in more flowers as you go, and even add a feather.
4. Trim the stems to about 1.5-2 inches, peeling off some of the foliage if necessary.
5. Wind the ribbon evenly around the stems and pin at the top back of the buttonhole.
6. Your buttonhole is now ready. Pop it in the fridge to keep it cool until it's ready for wearing.
